Transforming Vision into Reality

Stage 1

If you've followed our TVR efforts throughout 2016, you know that we have embarked upon a four-year plan to transform our Vision of a Vibrant 21st Century Church into the reality lived by each member, congregation, district, and ministry. As Executive Director Jody McCoy and I have shared, this journey can be described as "finding our identity in Christ and becoming more like Him as we share His love with others."

Throughout the first year (2016), we traveled extensively and worked closely with our core executive team members — the district superintendents — to develop this three-stage plan and prepare the Church for it. I trust that your congregation is using TVR posters and booklets. Now it is 2017, and Stage 1 has begun.

This stage is a yearlong focus on our personal relationship with Jesus Christ. Via sermons, Sabbath school quarterlies, the TVR booklet, and articles in *Churchright* and the *Bible Advocate*, we will concentrate on Jesus. Only Jesus lived a sinless life, qualifying Him to give His life as a ransom for us. Only Jesus died for our sins that we might be redeemed from sin and its penalties. Only by God's grace through faith in Jesus can we be saved and made new. Throughout 2017 we will focus on who Jesus is, what He has accomplished, and what it means for us individually if we receive Jesus as Savior and Lord.

The purpose of this concentrated focus on Jesus is twofold: knowledge and response. We want everyone to know Jesus because "there is no other name under heaven that has been given among men by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12, NASB). And we want everyone to respond to Jesus with personal belief, total commitment, and overwhelming gratitude for who He is and what He has accomplished.

Stage 1 has begun. In 2017 join fellow members of your church as we all grow closer to Christ and find our identity in Him.
