Voting Eligibility at Convention 2019

Voting in the convention business sessions is limited to registered GC members who have also registered to vote. When a person registers to vote, the voting registration team verifies that the individual is a registered GC member.

To facilitate this process, the GC office must receive an individual's GC membership application no later than **June 17**. Individuals who have not become GC members by that date will not be eligible to vote at the convention.

If you are already a registered GC member, the deadline does not concern you. If you think you are but wonder if your membership is in our database, please contact the GC office as soon as possible.

Teaching About Passover

On April 20 the Saginaw church held a Passover Teaching Service for its children. They learned about the history and purpose of the Lord's Supper – from the sacraments to the type of meal Jesus and His disciples would have eaten. They also dressed the part to make it come to life.

Children sat around the Seder table to experience some of the foods the Jewish people would have eaten and to understand their significance. For example, lettuce dipped in salt water represented the tears that the Jews shed in Egypt. Children also made their own matzah bread (without leavening), which represented the Jews' haste in leaving Egypt.

Most important, through this great experience the children understood that the Lord's Supper is a remembrance of what Jesus has done for us all. It is not to be taken lightly, but done with reverence and thanksgiving.

Clifford G. Tuttle (1936 - 2019)

Clifford G. Tuttle (82) was born October 23, 1936, in Janesville, Wisconsin. He died April 16, 2019, in his home in Fargo, North Dakota.



Clifford attended Spring Vale Academy and William Jewel College in Liberty, Missouri, and was a graduate of Midwest Bible College. He taught school in Kiefer, Oklahoma; farmed in Ipswich, South Dakota; and served as a nursing home administrator in North Dakota.

Beyond this, Cliff was a faithful, lifelong member of the Church of God (Seventh Day). In the 1960s he served as pastor of the churches in Alfred, North Dakota; Kansas City, Missouri; and Tulsa, Oklahoma. Cliff was also a member of the Fargo church for about 20 years. He worked with Lutheran Social Services to assist refugees in the area, helping prepare them for their driving test. Cliff never met a stranger and always had a friendly word and a good story to share.

Cliff is survived by Deloris, his wife of 60 years; three sons Darryl (Annette), Richard (Rachel), and Bill (Rae); nine grandchildren; and four great-grandchildren. He is preceded in death by his infant son, Clifford James.




Coming up ...
