Omaha Convention Business

Three afternoon business sessions were held during the recent General Conference Convention in Omaha, Nebraska. As required by our bylaws, the agenda for these meetings included the "State of the Conference" address, reports of the treasurer and auditor, reports of General Conference ministries, reports of committees, election of members to the board of directors, election of two members to the Nominating Committee, and appointments of committees.

The members present elected Brad Ciavarella, Jody McCoy, Dennis O'Banion, and Larry Zaragoza to full six-year terms on the board of directors. Manuel Salazar was elected to serve two years on the board, filling a vacancy created by the resignation of Carl Palmer. (The 2013-2015 board of directors, in addition to the members newly elected, includes Mark Caswell, Erik Dunn, Jose Hernandez, Samuel Holland, Ruben Marquez, Raul Romo, and Loren Stacy. Appreciation and gratitude are offered to outgoing board members Chip Hinds, Wayne Hrenyk, and John Tivald.) The members in session also elected Abel Salazar and Paul Carlin to the 2013-2015 Nominating Committee.

On the Sunday following convention, the board of directors appointed Brian Larson and Jon Harvey to complete the 2013-2015 Nominating Committee and appointed Jon Harvey chairman. The board also elected its officers for the coming two years (Loren Stacy, chairman; Samuel Holland, vice-chairman; Jose Hernandez, secretary; and Brad Ciavarella, treasurer) and created a CEO Succession Sub-Committee to move the board forward in its selection of our next General Conference president.

One proposed amendment to our bylaws was reported and considered during convention — an amendment that, if adopted, would have prohibited district superintendents from serving on the board of directors. This proposed amendment was not adopted.

Four resolutions were reported, two of which were adopted. The first adopted resolution created a committee to prepare a revision of our General Conference bylaws for consideration at our 2015 convention. The members of this Bylaws Revision Committee are Samuel Holland, chairman, Robert Coulter, Chip Hinds, Raul Romo, Whaid Rose, Loren Stacy, Israel Steinmetz, and Heber Vega. Parliamentarian Allan Burlison will serve this committee as a consultant.

The second adopted resolution calls for a study of

electronic voting, to qualified members of the General Conference who are not attending convention. This resolution's sponsors (Steve Krome, Mike Vlad, and Larry Zaragoza) have agreed to serve as a committee to conduct this study. Finally, Israel Steinmetz, Samuel Holland, and Raul Romo were appointed to serve as the 2013-2015 Amendments Committee.

Churchmanship Award

The 2013 Churchmanship Award was given to Art and Martha Cummings of Holland, Michigan (Martha passed away a year ago this summer). The Cummings have been known and admired throughout the Church for their selfless service over many years. A picture of the presentation is not available because, in keeping with the humble Cummings manner, Whaid Rose did not invite Art to the front to publicly receive this honor.
